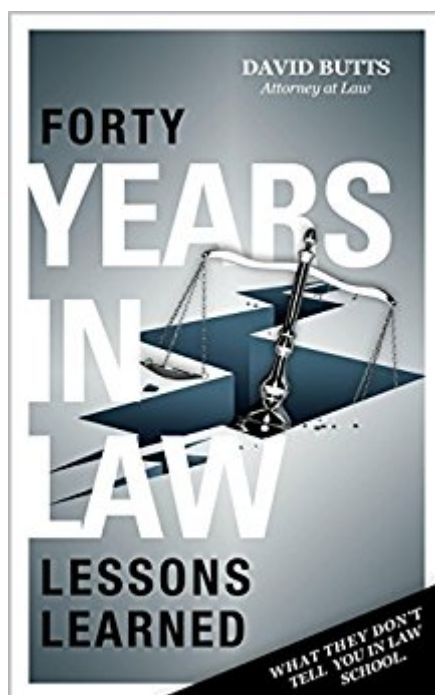

I had high hopes that this would provide interesting reading. But the formatting of the book is too horrible to read. Here is an excerpt. As noted, only the most flagrant cases get prosecuted, and the vast majority of Troll/judge corruption is subtle and undetectable. That is, the corruption is undetectable, but the results of the corruption are not. Judges have a tremendous amount of discretion. They are held in error by 4640 Years In Law: Lessons Learned an appellate court only for a "manifest abuse" of discretion or an error of law.
