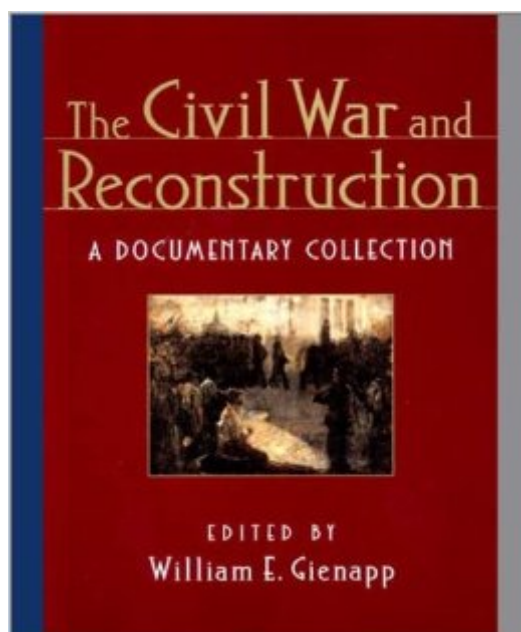

This was a very important book for Civil War scholars to have in the time before the digitization of historical documents became widespread. It may not be as important today, but it is still an extremely handy collection of primary source documents that cover the Civil War and Reconstruction eras. What makes it so useful today is that instructors can use the collection to select documents as well as have the book for a reference for students who may not have access to the Internet. The use of primary sources is very important as they provide the information needed for historians to develop interpretations from. William Gienapp was a professor of history at Harvard. He passed away in 2003 at the far too young age of 59. Considered to be an extremely gifted historian of the 19th century, Gienapp wrote several books about historical events in that century. He was a highly regarded professor who had the great fortune to teach a course [Baseball and the American Society, 1840-Present](#) • which was received quite well by Harvard students. This

collection of primary sources was a work he undertook that grew from his teaching methods. I first encountered this book via Eric Foner's EdX courses on the Civil War and Reconstruction. It was part of Foner's required readings and he referred to the documents and the book constantly in his lectures. I decided to pick up the book even though I had read most of the documents because I wanted to be able to access the documents at any time. So far, I've used the book on multiple occasions which has justified its purchase easily. Another thing I like about the book is that it shows how Gienapp selected documents for inclusion. He chose the relevant ones that students should be familiar with.
