

In â celn the Longhouse, â • the second section, Rival focuses on the intimate relations that create human persons and enact kinship relations. She also discusses womenâ ™s lives and perspectives. The third section, â celn the Midst of Enemies, â • considers how Huaorani society fits in larger political and economic contexts, illustrating how native values shape their encounters with oil companies, the state, and other external forces. Rival carefully analyzes insider/outsider dialectics wherein Huaorani people re-create meaningful and valued worlds in the face of alien projects, such as petroleum development, carbon trading, or intercultural education. Capitalizing on the authorâ ™s decades-long study and interactions in the community, Huaorani Transformations in Twenty-First-Century Ecuador brings new insights to the Huaoraniâ ™s unique way of relating to humans, to other-than-humans, and to the forest landscape they have inhabited for centuries.
